

## **2017 Heritage Thermal Services Environmental Grants**

\$250 – BEAVER LOCAL LEO CLUB: Purchase plants and materials for a landscaping project on the Beaver Local School campus. Students in the Leo Club, which is the high-school subsidiary of local Lions' clubs, will design and install the landscaping.

\$300 – LISBON MONTESSORI PRESCHOOL: Purchase classroom materials for worm composting, a butterfly garden and vegetable farming so students can begin learning "green habits."

\$300 – WELLSVILLE HAMMOND PARK COMMISSION: Purchase ground cover and mulch for the children's play area in Wellsville's Hammond Park.

\$400 – FRIENDS OF BEAVER CREEK STATE PARK: Fund replacement of the Wedding Garden in Pioneer Village that was destroyed by a fire in 2013.

\$500 – EAST LIVERPOOL HIGH SCHOOL HEALTH DEPARTMENT: Reduce use of disposal plastic water bottles by purchasing reusable ones for all health-class students.

\$500 – EAST LIVERPOOL HIGH SCHOOL JOB TRAINING PROGRAM: Expand existing recycling program in the school to include aluminum and paper. Students will set up program materials and work with Heritage Thermal Services staff, who will pick up the recyclables.

\$650 – BEAVER CREEK WILDLIFE EDUCATION CENTER: Fund new wildlife displays that feature native fish of Ohio, macroinvertebrates, a bear den and a beaver lodge.

\$750 – LaCROFT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: Establish a school-wide recycling program managed by fourth-grade students, called the Green Team.

\$750 – TEAM MOJO: Donate a digital weather station to middle-school science teachers in East Liverpool, Beaver Local, Wellsville, American Spirit Academy and Oak Glen schools to promote environmental studies.

\$750 – EAST LIVERPOOL-CALCUTTA AREA GARDEN CLUB: Support for the club's many community beautification projects at the Serpentine Garden, Museum of Ceramics, and Thompson Park; and help fund The Children's Nature Festival, which is held in Thompson Park every other September.

\$750 – EAST LIVERPOOL COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP FOR REVITALIZATION – URBAN CORE COMMITTEE: Purchase materials for volunteers to build plant boxes that will be placed in downtown East Liverpool and maintained by committee members.

\$750 – RIVER VALLEY YOUTH BASEBALL: Install a self-sustaining water-management system that will collect storm water and runoff for watering the four fields at the complex.
